

BRM 50th Anniversary Celebration: Bourne

What a fantastic day! This was a celebration of 50 years since BRM brought the Formula 1 World Championship home to Bourne in 1962, with Graham Hill.

EEMC/SEECCC sent along a crew of marshals to assist as Bourne became a magnet for motorsport enthusiasts and many others from far and wide. Reportedly 27,000 people were there to witness the likes of Jackie Stewart, Jackie Oliver, Howden Ganley, Richard Attwood and Damon Hill driving a huge range of BRM machinery (and some others, notably Stewart in the Tyrrell 006) through the centre of town.

In addition there were F1 cars, transporters and personalities from the 1960s and 70s plus an array of road cars from the era, including a number owned by our own Club members parading their classics.

Many thanks to those of you who came out to assist with the marshalling duties or to parade your cars and to Richard Bostock, David Dykes, Rick Hall and everyone at Bourne & BMRC for organising everything.
