Phil Tucker's Morris stood out amongst more modern transport at the School Prom held at Springfields recently






Paul Pollard sent in this letter he received: Dear Paul,

#### TAX EXEMPTION

**David Chapman** has sent in this information on tax exemption which he has encountered whilst sorting out the tax status of his **Fiat Spider** which just qualifies for the 40 year-old exemption. His car has a first registration date of 1-1-1976. He points out that

- 1. If a vehicle becomes tax exempt now you have to **apply** for the exemption
- 2. Cars registered in the **first week of 1976** are deemed to be manufactured in 1975

Cars built before 1976 qualified for free road tax from 1 April 2016. To join the band of tax-free classics, all you have to do is prove your car was built (not registered) before 1 January 1976. But don't be fooled – this isn't done automatically. If you've got a car that now qualifies for free Vehicle Excise Duty then you'll have to do a bit of paperwork. Such a task can be overwhelming, but one thing is clear – apply immediately, rather than waiting until you current period of tax has expired.

There is some good news, though. If the vehicle was registered between 1-7 January, 1976, the DVLA will let you register it as a historic vehicle, based on the assumption that the vehicle would have been made in the previous year.

#### How to apply for Historic Vehicle tax

First of all, you'll need to take the following documents will need to be taken to a motor tax Post Office.

- The V5C Registration Certificate. In the change section, put the tax class as Historic Vehicle, and sign and date the V5C. (Ignore any legacy note relating to DVLA Local Office.)
- A V10 Application for a Tax Disc. On the form indicate a tax class of Historic Vehicle. (Ignore any note relating to an insurance certificate requiring to be produced).
- Valid MoT Certificate.

The Post Office will retain the V5C and post it onto DVLA in order for them to change the tax class to Historic Vehicle and issue a new V5C. Subsequent V11 Renewal Reminders should have the tax class of Historic Vehicle.

#### • SPOTTED •



This is a unique **Cottin & Desgouttes** Type 16M3S •spotted• on the 20/49 Club stand at the Stamford Show. It was built in Lyon, France in 1924 and is one of just 3 in the UK and around 20 surviving cars worldwide. This is the only one in existence with a British body, perhaps by Weymann.

Cottins were built from 1905-33 and were known, in their time, for their innovation and foresight and this car featured four wheel braking, four speed gearbox and a full electric system including a self-starter, features which didn't appear on British cars until many years later. This example has been in the hands of the current owner's family since 1950.
