MY CLASSIC: BILL FISHER

Rover 820 Sterling 5 dr Hatchback

My car was first registered on 1st. September 1998, originally as S460 CNV, to a Mrs. U. Macmillan of Spalding. I acquired the car in May 2002, at 38,704 miles. It has been re-registered G8 TLM which is because my previous Super Pacer aircraft (pictured) was G-BTLM. Frankly, I can't be bothered to change to G8 SED - if it is available - to go with my current one!

My Sterling has done about 66,000 miles in my ownership, and is still being used regularly. Recently, I undertook some life extension work on the car having it rust- treated at Rustbusters in Spalding. This was in addition to having new shock absorbers, clutch, fuel pump, and brake and coolant hoses, whilst the spares were still available. Some minor attention has been carried out to the bodywork, which was almost totally rust-free.

When announced, the Sterling was described as the 'luxury saloon flagship' model so it has a high specification, even by modern standards. However, it is now a fairly rare type and, at the end of 2014, the DVLA only listed 34 manual and 70 automatic examples of the 820 Sterling as still being taxed for road use.
