#### My Classic: Rover P6

BDO 332C was first registered on the 1<sup>st</sup> February 1965, in fact she has only just had her 53<sup>rd</sup> birthday. The car was first delivered to Ray Bettinson (my father in-law) at Fulney Service Station on Holbeach Road, Spalding.

On dry days the car would always stand in pride of place outside the garage for all customers to admire, as shown in the picture from the BP progression paper which was printed May 1965. Ray would only ever use the car at the weekends and for holidays (weather permitting). I was actually allowed to drive the car once when Ray asked if I could pick him up from the Worksop airfield. Before setting off, I was given a complete debrief on how to drive the car, including instruction to never go above 50 miles an hour!

In 1987, with only 45,000 miles on the clock, the car was laid up after having a generous coating of oil and grease to protect the underside, and a covering of blankets protecting the paintwork. In 1998, Ray announced that he would like me to have the car and transferred the log book into my name. I duly became only the second proud owner of BDO 332C.

The car lay idle until my daughter Joanne was due to be married in 2005, and asked if she could use it for her wedding, as Christine and I had done for our wedding. So BDO 332C was to be reborn. One very cold day in January 2005, my friend Keith (luckily he was an engineer) and I opened up the workshop door to uncover and hopefully start the Rover. After replacing the fuel and oil and fitting a new battery the key was turned for the first time in twenty years. At this point Ray entered the workshop and asked what we were doing. I told him that we were trying to start the Rover because Joanne his granddaughter had asked if she could use the car for her wedding. The smile on his face at this point was one of great satisfaction and pride. He took one look at us and said "well that will never start, first you will need to clean the carburettor, blow out the jets and replace the 'O' rings and gaskets". I said: "Where on earth would I get the parts required for that?" "In the stores over there" he answered with confidence. He would deal with the carb during the following week so Keith and I could return the following Sunday to start the car.

The next weekend soon arrived. Anxiously, I returned to the garage to hopefully see my Rover running. After a lot of huffing and puffing and 24 volts spinning the engine over, the car finally burst into life. In the process, it nearly killed those of us who were trying to revive her. She threw out so much black smoke and fumes in the workshop, that we all had to run outside for some fresh air! But, after a couple of hours of altering this and tweaking that, she soon began to idle very nicely. At this point we called it a day and I returned the following weekend to drive it home to valet both inside and out thoroughly. My first job was to remove a very tasteful pair of leopard skin front seat covers! After a full weekend of cleaning and polishing, my Willow Green Rover 2000 began to resemble a car fit for a bride.

The Rover performed perfectly over the wedding weekend, admired by all family and friends. At this point, I decided that I would like to refurbish the car, not a full refurb but just to tidy up the rust bubbles that were starting to appear on the rear wings. I wanted to keep the car original, so as it looked as close as possible to the car back in 1965. That included keeping the original Radiomobile long and medium wave radio that was fitted to the car from new. Sadly, you can now only listen to Radio 4, something you begin to get used to when you are in the car for any length of time.

In 2006, a specialist rebuilt the engine, replacing big and small ends, pistons, polishing the head and hardening the exhaust valves to enable the engine to run on green fuel. The following year the car went into the paint shop to have a corner of the roof replaced as it had a problem with aluminium rust. Whilst it was there, I decided to have the four wings replaced including the rear inner wings plus the outer and inner sills and a respray in the original colour. The car came out of the paint shop after 3 months looking fantastic. Over the years many people have commented about



the unusual colour and how much it suits the car. These comments encouraged me to take the car to local shows. On these outings the car would gain a lot of attention; there was always someone who would be very pleased to tell me that their father or grandfather owned a car just like mine. During 2017 I worked on the interior as 22 years of my father in law's cigar smoke had certainly paid its toll, bless him! I have dyed the leather seats and roof lining and lately fitted a new carpet which I am very pleased with. Now BDO322C is ready for its next show.

As a member of the Rover P6 Owners Club, in 2013 we took the car to the Rover 50<sup>th</sup> anniversary National show at Waddesdon Manor, where both Christine and I were extremely proud that the car came away with a first for the Rover 2000 class. In 2017, at the National show at Castle Howard in North Yorkshire, BDO 332C took the runners up prize for the Rover 2000 class; I was very pleased but slightly disappointed it didn't take the first prize. A little more polish and elbow grease needed perhaps? For anyone who is an Owners Club member and has not attended the National shows, I can highly recommend them. You meet so many great people who are always willing to offer help and advice if required. Our chairperson Deborah organises these shows brilliantly, makes everyone welcome and is always pleased to meet and greet new members.

Due to our success at Castle Howard, the Club invited me to take my car along to the Classic Car Show at the NEC in November 2017; what a great experience! I didn't realise that the show was so big and well attended; it plays such an important part of the classic car calendar. So many people visited our stand and made positive remarks about the car, particularly about its unusual colour! Having had so much interest at that event, I'm invited to display the car again at the NEC Classic Car Restoration Show. Apparently, the chairperson said she would like me to help on the stand again at the NEC, but I think the truth is she would really like to see BDO 332C there again! Better go now as I have a lot more polishing to get on with!
