JULY 1: BASTON CAR & BIKE SHOW...

Our club had a stand at this show (above) which attracted a huge number of people to a field alongside the A15 on a gorgeous day.

Thanks to all who helped out – Graham Faulkner's Bond Bug (right) was definitely a big hit, attracting a lot of admirers.



...OR FENLAND WINGS & WHEELS

Whilst some members attended the Baston Show, others were at the Wings and Wheels event at Fenland Airfield. The two events showed different aspects of our motoring interest and whilst Baston was a pre-book event, Fenland is very much a *turn up and display* show, with vehicles coming and going as the owners wished and the public free to wander round the exhibits, with controlled groups going to look at the aircraft.

A wide variety of vehicles were on show, from motor cycles and tractor to car from the early 1920s to very modern. I saw an 08 plate Aston Martin and a couple of relatively modern Rolls-Royces. John Wright, who owns the airfield, displayed his specials mainly based on vintage lorry chassis. One though is what appears at first glance to be a car from the 1920's with chain drive to the rear wheels but is actually based on a Citroen 2CV, the chain drive actually going to the inboard rear brakes! The most valuable vehicle displayed, but missed by many, was a replica of Stirling Moss's Aston Martin DBR1 (original sold at auction for £17.5 million). There were, however other, more affordable vehicles from the 1950s and 60s including an Austin Westminster Mk. II, which was the company director's car of its day, down to a Renault Dauphin which I thought had all rusted away long ago; my mother's certainly did! I also spotted an Austin Moke, a car I used to hanker after but was told many years ago: Bill – you're too Maxi for a Mini!!

It you want to attend an event next year, where you can buy a burger and a homemade cake at fair prices and wander around chatting to other classic car owners, Fenland Wings & Wheels is well worth attending. *Bill Fisher*
