## March clubnight: Tremendous response for Colin Crabbe

Our Club was very honoured to have **Colin Crabbe** as our speaker at last month's clubnight open evening at Whaplode Manor. Colin gave an excellent account of almost 50 years working with cars on almost every level mostly from his base at Baston, but extending to many parts of the globe from his native Scotland to places as far afield as South Africa, New Zealand and South America. Quite how he (a) found so many rare cars and (b) managed to buy them and ship them back to the UK for restoration is a testament to his skill and determination. The quality of the job he was able to do also attracted



some of the world's top customers so it was a great story to hear.

Still an owner of various exotica, Colin is well known for a short period in 1969 & 1970 when he ran his own **Formula 1** team under the *Antique Automobiles* banner. He ran a Cooper and then a McLaren for Vic Elford in 1969, finishing 6th at the British GP and was the first team owner to give the late, great Ronnie Peterson (pictured with Colin above) his first taste of F1 in a semi-works March car the year after.

The response to Colin was absolutely first class with an unprecedented **105 people** attending (apologies for the queue at the bar but we hadn't really anticipated so many). Thanks to everyone who came along to support the evening.

Thanks also, in particular, to Colin but importantly to Brian Gilham for making the arrangements for SEECCC. I must also mention Richard & Matthew Bostock and Joy & Nigel Mann for their help in making the evening run smoothly, culminating in a fantastic £370 raised for Colin's nominated charity, Lincolnshire Air Ambulance.
