MOTORSPORT UK LICENCES

All SEECCC members are, by default, a member of our parent club, East Elloe Motor Club Ltd, and so you can now apply for a **free** RS Clubman motorsports licence. This can be used to participate in Autocross/Clubcross (inc. Minicross), Autotest/Autosolo Trials, Cross Country and Road & Navigational Rallying (inc. 12 Car & Scatter) which are run on a Motorsport UK Clubman permit. Some of you may do this type of event already but please be aware that this is the first year when a licence has been necessary even for closed to club events. To participate in any other higher grade event, you need to apply for a Motorsport UK Competition Licence either online or by downloading the application form from

https://www.motorsportuk.org/resourcecentre/competitors-licensing/ and emailing it to membership@motorsportuk.org
