We aim to arrive at approximately 1.00pm/1.30pm





- 1. East Elloe Motor Club Limited, through its specialist section, Spalding & East Elloe Classic Car Club, will promote its 27th Annual Classic Car Run on Sunday, 15th June 2025.
- 2. The meeting will be run in accordance with the Motorsport UK Regulations as a touring assembly. The meeting will be governed by Motorsport UK's General Regulations, these supplementary regulations and any written instructions issued for the event.
- 3. This event is open to members and non-members of the promoting club, entering cars of at least 20 years old. (Exceptions to this age rule may be allowed at the organiser's discretion for interesting cars). The entry fee includes day membership of the promoting Club for non-members.
- 4. The event will start from Pennell's Four Seasons Garden Centre London Rd Silk Willoughby NG34 8NY
- 5. Registration will take place on arrival at the start from 9.00 am.
- 6. All entrants must sign the declaration form at registration to confirm they have valid insurance for the event.
- 7. Cars will be identified by rally plates issued at registration, which must be fixed to the front of the vehicle.
- 8. Cars will begin to leave the start at around 9.45 am, at one-minute intervals on a suggested total route of approximately 80 miles using instructions from the road book or map.
- 9. The lunch halt will be at Hemswell Court, Lancaster Green, Hemswell Cliff, Gainsborough DN21 5TQ. Cars are expected to begin to arrive by 12 noon for pre-booked lunch (please see order form). Lunch will be served from 12.30 pm. For people wishing to picnic, there is limited space available within the grounds. Please park as directed by marshals. Cars should aim to leave the lunch venue by 2:00 pm.
- 10. The finish will be at: International Bomber Command Centre, Canwick Ave, Lincoln, LN4 2HQ

Another Country, Another Car Museum

The lengths I go to, to find you more car museums! This time I had to go all the way to New Zealand, but fortunately our very generous chairman has said the club will cover my travelling costs, so that's not so bad. (I think that big thump I just heard was Joy hitting the floor!)

This particular museum was actually part of a much larger aircraft one, displaying planes from both World Wars. Both museums are the culmination of years of collecting, restoring, and in many cases replicating, by one man, and although the settings in which the aircraft had been placed, something realised by a company who usually does film sets apparently, were impressive, I think the actual content was maybe a little



disappointing, especially regarding the number of replicas on display, but there again, we are rather spoilt in this country, with the likes of Duxford. The picture shows 'trophy hunters' ransacking the 'Red Baron's' Fokker Dr.1 Triplane, after he had been shot down. One interesting little snippet, was that, for years, it had been thought that he had been downed by a pilot from the opposing side, but recent investigations have revealed that he was actually shot by an Australian infantry soldier, who had shot from the ground, up through the seat of the plane: I bet that made his eyes water!

Anyway, on to the cars. The collection was mostly Australian and American stuff, although there was a smattering of British metal, particularly Jaguars. The guy who looked after the collection was pretty knowledgeable, and I think he enjoyed talking to someone who wasn't only there because it just happened to be part of the plane museum, and was actually interested in the cars themselves.

This 'Lotus Escort' is about as near as they had to 'the real thing', but it was quite interesting all the same, and apparently the demand for this era Fords is as strong out in NZ as it is here. They seem to have a pretty free choice of number plates out there, so we did see some pretty good ones on our travels.

All the cars were in running condition, and the museum had its own workshop which, in typical NZ disregard for health and safety, you could just wander into and take a look around.

There isn't too much more I can say really, so I will just attach some pictures, and hope you enjoy them.

I will however leave you with one little reminiscence of our time in NZ, and it concerns a meeting with a lady of advancing years, whom we spotted pushing her bike up a hill.

Now what you need to know, before I start, is that the New Zealanders pronounce their 'E's' as 'I's', so a speck of dust would sound like a *spick* of dust.
