## 'Bond Enigma' Visit – 20 September BOOK NOW!

Stuart and Sue Gibbard have arranged for us to visit the **Bond Enigma Project** at Hilborough, near Swaffham, on **Saturday 20th September**. A great opportunity to see Martin Williamson's privately owned collection of James Bond cars and 007-related memorabilia and film props, which is not normally open to the public. As well as the Bond theme, Martin also has a Jensen Interceptor from The Saint television series starring Ian Ogilvy, and other vehicles with TV connections.





There is an excellent pub nearby, the Swan at Hilborough, where we have arranged lunch. We expect there to be a lot of interest in this event and so, depending on numbers, Martin has suggested we split the visit into two groups of 20 people and/or 10 cars. The first group will arrive at the collection for 11.30am and then will have lunch booked at the Swan for 2pm. The second group will have lunch at 12pm and then make their way to Martin's for around 1.45pm.
