Yorkshire Elegance

With our family holiday to the Lake District approaching, Sue and I decided to set off a couple of days early so we could take in the Yorkshire Elegance event while enroute to Cumbria. Held at Grantley Hall, near Ripon, from 23-24 July, this prestigious concours features displays of some of the world's finest automobiles. Most of the cars at the event are worth mind-boggling sums of money, and are way beyond our means, but it's interesting to see how the other half lives. A special display of Aston Martins, including the 1930 LM4 Le Mans car and the 1950 Works DB2, was another draw.

However, our main reason for visiting was because our friend and renowned historian, Daniel Ward, was giving a presentation on the dawn of motoring. As always, Daniel didn't disappoint, and it was a fascinating insight into the birth of transport from boneshaker bicycles to the early automobiles of Benz, Daimler, Levassor, Peugeot and others.

Elsewhere in the magnificent grounds were some very famous vehicles such as Mike Hawthorn's 1955 Jaguar D-Type and a 1928 Mercedes S-Type. Other exotica ranged from a 1964 Ferrari 275 GTB (judged Overall Best in Show) and a 1968 Lamborghini Islero (Best in Classic Class) to a 1931 Bentley 8.0 litre Coupe (Best in Vintage Class) and McLaren SLR (Winner of Future Classic Class).
